We thank all of those who contributed to this important discussion, and I give special thanks to Lisa, Eve, Melanie and all of the other women who worked so

hard on this project. We eagerly await the report that will be generated and distributed in conjunction with the Initiative.

WLU just held another very successful Banter With The Bench, which was coordinated by Joanna Miller, Chair of WLU's Career Development & Advancement Committee. Many thanks to Joanna, her Committee, and all of the Judges who participated in the Banter.

## Initiative on the Advancement and Retention of Women in Law Firms

While talking about how to retain women attorneys may seem out of place in this economic climate, this discussion is even more important now. Throwing money at attorneys over the last ten years has not provided the answer and today is no longer possible for many firms. Instead firms to look deeper into issues of attorney retention and come up with workable solutions. WLU is facilitating this investigation.

WLU surveyed all people admitted to the Utah Bar between 1985 and 2005. The survey asked attorneys questions about their current and past job satisfaction, discrimination, and experience. In preparing this survey Professor Vaughn Call from Brigham Young University helped make sure it was statistically sound. Over fifty percent of those in the target audience took the survey. We found that 47% of male attorneys worked in law firms while only 30% of female attorneys did. Women instead seemed to have greater representation in government. In addition, nine percent of women reported being unemployed and not looking for work. Given these results, WLU believes Utah firms are not retaining women as easily as they retain men.

Following the survey, WLU hosted two symposia discussing the findings and developing proposed best practices to address the issues raised. Both symposia drew well over 100 attendees, many of whom had never attended a WLU event previously. Chief Justice Durham hosted the first symposium, and Dean Chodosh and Dean Rasband introduced and concluded the second symposium.

The symposia had experts present the demographics, issues, and strategies both locally and nationally. Our experts included Cynthia Thomas Calvert, Assistant Director of the Project for Attorney Retention (PAR), Blane R. Prescott from Hildebrandt International, Mary Crane of Mary Crane & Associates, and Karen Lockwood of the Lockwood Group, LLC. We had local luminaries assist in explaining their successes including Charlotte Miller of Kirton & McConkie, Janet Hugie Smith of Ray, Quinney & Nebeker, Magistrate Judge Paul Warner, and Jody Williams of Holme, Roberts & Owen. During each symposium we

took time to break out into smaller groups to ensure all voices were heard. Given the tremendous turnout, we were extremely grateful to all of our focus group leaders: Nathan D. Alder, Lois Baar, Peter Billings, Mark K. Buchi, Patricia W. Christensen, Jane Reister Conard, Denise A. Dragoo, Matthew M Durham, Timothy C. Hout, Annette W. Jarvis, Anthony C. Kaye, Doug Monson, Paul Moxley, James Rasband, Lauren Scholnick, Lowry Snow, Michele M. Straube, and D. Zachary Wiseman.

Currently, WLU is compiling and publishing a report of its findings both from the survey and the symposia. This report will assist law firms and lawyers with understanding what issues exist and what solutions are possible in choosing a career with a private firm.

To best address the problems and develop solutions that will help law firms retain and promote their best associates, we have drawn and continue to draw on the support of much of the legal community—the law firms, the law schools, the Bar. ## Congratulations to the WLU 2009 Woman of the Year: Barbara Bearnson

On April 28, 2009, Women Lawyers of Utah named Barbara Bearnson the 2009 Christine M. Durham Woman Lawyer of the Year at its Annual Fireside Chat. The Fireside Chat is a yearly gathering of members and guests to hear an address from Chief Justice

Christine M. Durham, of the Utah Supreme Court. Criteria for the award include professional excellence and integrity, demonstrated through an awareness of the needs and concerns of women, and advancement of women inside and outside the legal profession. Former recipients include women from the judiciary, private practice, and government practice.

Ms. Bearnson began her prosecutorial career in the Salt Lake County Attorney's Office in 1983, where she prosecuted felony and misdemeanor cases. Her sound judgment, innate intelligence, and compassion for victims resulted in her assignment to the Special Victims Team, where she specialized in the prosecution of child abuse, sexual assault and other violent crimes. In 1988, she was hired by the Utah Attorney General's Office, where she worked in the Criminal Appeals Section and become one of the founding members of the Child Abuse Protection Unit. In that role, she prosecuted child abuse cases and provided training and assistance to deputy county attorneys statewide.

As an Assistant United States Attorney, Ms. Bearnson has effectively prosecuted a broad range of criminal cases for over 15 years. Based upon her abilities, she was promoted to the Deputy Chief of the Violent Crimes Section, and then to Chief of the General Crimes and White Collar Section. In 2006, she was appointed Chief of the Criminal Division where she oversees the entirety of federal criminal prosecutions filed in this state. Her breadth of experience, demonstrated skills, and strong work ethic are respected and valued by her colleagues in her office and her peers throughout the legal community.

In addition to her remarkable legal career, Ms. Bearnson served for many years on the Board of Directors for the Salt Lake City YWCA. Ms. Bearnson's efforts on behalf of the YWCA were at the forefront of efforts to stop family violence.

Ms. Bearnson also serves as a role model in her family life, as the mother of three children. Because of her commitment to her own family, she is sensitive to, and considerate of, the needs and concerns of other working mothers. As a member of upper manage-
